Praying at Christmas

Rev. David Turtle (Circuit Superintendent and this year's Methodist President) wrote in the December Newsletter:

"Lots of us might confess to being overwhelmed by the awfulness of what has unfolded in the world in recent months and years (in Ukraine, Israel/Gaza and beyond). We can feel a sense of helplessness, and question how we can begin to respond, even in our prayers.

It may seem glib to suggest that, in this season of Advent, we might not focus so much on the question, 'What's the world coming to?' but rather, 'Who has come to the world?' And yet, if we truly believe that the One who came to be God with us is indeed the King of kings, Lord of lords, and Prince of peace, it is no empty, futile thing to pray into situations of global disruption and mayhem.

How can we pray? A few suggestions:

- In prayer, we remind ourselves that our Lord is the God of the nations. The world has not slipped out of God's hand.
- We pray that evil will not prevail and that those intent on violence will not have the last word.
- We pray for the innocent on all sides of all conflicts.
- Even if we don't know what to pray, we still pray. Because the moment we stop praying, we give over to hopelessness, stop living as people of the Kingdom, and become practical atheists. It is better to come with our faltering words in faith, than no prayers at all.

We live in a world where miracles are needed. As we reflect again this Advent on the greatest miracle: that our God loved us so completely that he sent his Son to be born, live, die and rise again for us, may we find grace to hold onto hope and keep praying for those in the places where hope is hardest to find."

New Year's Eve Reflections – Sunday 31 December 11am – we'll worship together on New Year's Eve in a more relaxed setting, the Minor Hall, with tea/coffee and pastries. The service will give us space to reflect on the year that has past and our hopes for the year that's to come.

Covenant Service – Sunday 7 January 11am – a moment to recognise God's loving promise to us and all the world, and respond in loving thankfulness and commitment.

<u>Special Congregational Prayer Meeting – Tuesday 16 January 8pm (Manse)</u> – in the *Prayer Focus Connexional Prayer Guide*, the Methodist President and Lay Leader write that 'keeping company with God in a rhythm of prayer is part of what leads to life lived freely and lightly'. The Church Council invite you to this second termly prayer gathering for our church and community.

Monday Night United Bible Studies – our online studies in Romans, shared with Broomhedge and Priesthill Methodists, will recommence in January on Monday evenings at 8pm.

<u>Guides Thinking Day – Sunday 25 February</u> – we're looking forward to being joined by the Girl Guides for their annual special service for renewing their promises and being thoughtful about the world.

Methodist Day of Fasting – Friday 1 March – part of a special season of prayer during Lent (14 February – 30 March), Methodists around Ireland will unite in prayer and fasting to seek God.
